

I plan to spend the next six months reading books set in the Medieval period to my seven year old son. I thought Usborne's "Medieval World" would be a good place to start. Right off the bat, it is

absurd to think that any 96 page illustrated book can do 1,500 years of world history any justice. There is just too much history to be covered in such a short format. But as an introduction, "Medieval World" gave my seven year old a pleasurable hint of what lay ahead in the next six months. My only wish is that Usborne had narrowed its focus and only concentrated on Europe for a shorter period of time.
